

What you need to know

Media Arts Students in Television Broadcasting.

It is important the every student be aware of the sequence and requirements to television classes. Here is a guideline so you can plan along with your advisor.

Required Courses

Every Broadcasting student is required to take both BDST 6 and BDST 25
You need to take these courses by the end of your sophomore year.

If you have taken BDST 25 you can take BDST 57 (Advanced Video Editing)
This is a continuation of the editing you learn in BDST 25.
You may take BDST 57 concurrently with BDST 6; however, you must take BDST 25 before you take BDST 57.

There are other courses available to you that have pre-requisites.

BDST 58 (TV Station Management)- *pre-req bdst 6 or bdst 25*

BDST 34 (Advanced Studio Production)- *pre-req bdst 6*

BDST 27/28 (Applied TV) *pre-req bdst 6 or bdst 25*

BDST 54 (Electronic News Gathering) - *pre-req of bdst 6 & 25*

We offer 3 credits in BDST 27/28 (Applied TV) this is an independent study at PTV.
You may work on shows, or create your own project. If you already crew shows this is a great course to take along with any other BDST courses. You may take this course twice, once as BDST 27 once as BDST 28

When you are a senior you will have a choice of doing a project or writing a paper. If you chose to do a project you will have had to take BDST 57. Don't be a senior without taking this course. We guarantee you will need to know Final Cut for any job you are applying for.

There are many electives you can take at Post., however, you can still take all the electives you like as well as all the broadcast electives we offer. Throughout your years at Post we may offer a special course during a semester, so always check with your professors for anything new.

Don't graduate without taking these courses, they will help you in your job search.
